Care Connection for Children, sponsored by the Virginia Department of Health, is a statewide network of regional programs that provides healthcare coordination, community support, and resources to children with special healthcare needs.

The team-based approach pulls together care coordinators, medical personnel, educators, and family members to determine how children with special healthcare needs can reach their maximum potential.

Care Coordinators can:

- Find a pediatrician, specialist or other healthcare provider
- Explore health insurance and payment options not covered by your insurance
- Identify resources in the community
- Connect with other families experiencing similar challenges
- Help you plan for your child's future

Educational Consultant can:

- Assist with special education concerns
- Attend an Individual Education Program (IEP) or 504 Plan meeting
- Help you to plan for your child's future

To be eligible for Care Connection Services, your child must:

- Live in Virginia
- Be under the age of 21
- Have a diagnosed physical disorder that is expected to last longer than 12 months
